# 6 Hinkley and Nuclear sector supply chain support update for LEP business leadership group (CM)

- HPC is a £18 billion project, which will employ up to 25,000 people during constructing, and deliver 900 permanent jobs, 1000 apprenticeships and £50 billion of total SW nuclear projects within the next fifteen years.
- Three year business support programmes to support businesses in HotSW LEP to access opportunities.
  - o Jointly funded by Hot SW and West of England
  - Contract won by SWMAS ltd heading a consortium of Somerset Chamber and business west
- Comments included strengthening links between supply chain and education opportunities

#### 7 Unlocking Growth Fund (JB)

- One project has been conditionally approved, three still need further clarifications.
- All the UFG money has been now provisionally allocated.

#### 8 Conference View (HH)
