#### <u>Highlight Report No 59 – SIP November 2020</u>

#### **Reporting period**

September/October 2020

## **Summary Comments**

Decisions at the September and Special October SIP meeting were as follows:

At the September SIP meeting no capital funding decisions were made.

At the October SIP meeting 21 Getting Building Fund (GBF) projects were reviewed and 20 were approved with 1 deferred for further details to be provided. Subsequently the final scheme was also approved by email. 5 project business cases were subsequently put forward for appraisal and review at the November SIP meeting, as there was headroom identified against the original allocations.

Further to the October SIP meeting a variation was agreed for the Somerset Flooding project to reflect changes in deliverables and enable expenditure to be managed through LEP freedoms and flexibilities for part of the project.

The Local Transport Board (LTB) met on 19<sup>th</sup> October and final approval was awarded to Houghton Barton, meaning the only Growth Deal project with business case approval outstanding is CDS GD3.

However, this funding allocation will be spent by the deadline under LEP freedoms and flexibilities. The LTB need to approve the scheme for Stage 4 of Torquay Gateway and that is expected to take place in November 2020.

The final 1/3 of LGF funding was confirmed by government and a positive Mid Year Review meeting took place in late September with no specific additional delivery actions identified.

The Q2 20/21 total LGF spend as per the dashboard due to be submitted to government and including freedoms and flexibilities was £13.78m, ahead of forecast for the quarter, bringing cumulative spend to approx. £170m.

The Getting Building Fund business cases were all submitted by the 1<sup>st</sup> September deadline, have been appraised and decisions made at the October SIP meeting. A further 5 business cases, next on the ranked list, have been appraised for decision at the November SIP to enable the underspend to be reallocated.

Outputs for Q2 are being processed and the quarterly dashboard will be circulated for email sign off by SIP and Somerset's s151 officer.

#### **Growth Deals**

**Business cases and funding agreements** 

All GD1 business cases are approved or partially approved. All GD2 business cases are now approved and funding agreements signed. On GD3 - CDS GD3 is now the only business case outstanding.

## **Delivery**

At end Q2 20/21, 45 capital projects have completed spending their Growth Deal funding. We have 16 live capital projects to complete expenditure in 20/21 with no live issues raised currently.

Monitoring will continue as per the projects' Monitoring and Evaluation Plans but we are expecting some outputs delays with live projects, as well as those in development, due to social distancing measures etc.

Funding agreements are due to be completed and signed by Christmas 2020 with project expenditure allowed from the announcement on 4<sup>th</sup> August 2020. Theme leads have been allocated to work with projects, SCC and PMO to work through the conditions and get signed funding agreements in place. Once all funding has been allocated, government guidance received and funding agreement schedules developed detailed expenditure and progress forecasts will be provided as per Growth Deal.

## **Growing Places Fund (no update)**

## **Programme Summary**

As per overall summary, the main activity has been on the transfer of the Accountable Body role over to Somerset CC. This involves transferring files (new section populated on SharePoint), novating funding agreements and transferring the funds. 2 projects have requested repayment holidays, as yet no further projects have requested extensions.

**DC Homes** – claims all paid. Progress claims will continue to be received until project completion. Variation requested for repayment schedule and meeting held in March 2020 to discuss. Subject to detailed management information this case to be reviewed in the Autumn 2020. A short-term repayment holiday given in the meantime (delegated decision). Their first payment was due in August 2020 and agreed LEP to review by November.

**Millfields** – **Genesis Centre.** A 3-month repayment holiday request has been submitted and was approved at the April SIP meeting with a letter sent to the project sponsor to confirm. A further request has now been received.

**Broadband** – GPF funding agreement signed Dec 2016 and project mobilisation has begun. A request to review expenditure profile has been discussed by SIP in January and an updated reprofile is awaited, subject to an overall review of the LEP area delivery contracted.

Other GPF projects are in repayment, repayment holiday or complete.
