4.1 Growing Places Fund

Business Cases for approval: Gravity and Roadfill

Tim Beavon joined the meeting to discuss his appraisals of the 4 bids.

- Pattimores Transport withdrew its project as the Growing Places loan was not needed for the project to go ahead.
- Gravity 1 Village Enhancement Scheme is an obligation therefore it is needed to be considered whether it should be funded.
- Gravity 2 Build new substation and connection for power for further development of the site. Total cost of project is £7m

Points raised

Gravity Village Enhancement Scheme

- Village enhancement scheme is an obligation for Gravity to undertake therefore it should not be funded
- Neither Gravity projects have provided a strong case for funding
- Questions around whether the funding is required for substation due to



high total project cost

- Cash flow information is required to make a decision.
- GPF Funding has previously included the caveat of recouping legal costs.

DECISION – Gravity Village Enhancement Scheme loan application declined.

Gravity Substation Project

- Questions around whether the funding is required for substation due to high total project cost
- Neither Gravity projects have provided a strong case for funding
- Cash flow information is required to make a decision.
- LEP have provided substantial cash support for the Enterprise Zone already and there is a case that the substation supports continued development of the business opportunity

Roadfill Itd

- Strong support for the business and product however it was agreed that more work needed on this application
- Recommended that Roadfill ltd are signposted to Growth Hub to get business case support.
- CG to engage with Roadfill with aim to facilitate a meeting between Roadfill Itd and potential interested parties.

DECISION – Roadfill Itd loan application declined

Growing Places Fund Grant Funding Agreement amendment

Growth Deal Funding Underspend Variation

 - Any amount over £250,000 SIP will provide recommendation to LEP board.
 - 'Total project costs' rather than match funding to be referenced in the decision.
- Need to consider process for projects that are going to or have failed to



deliver the outputs stated in their funding agreements

Exeter Science Park Open Innovation Building Variation

JB provided overview of ESPL variation

- Electric charging points and CCTV installing into car park using Growth Deal underspend from this scheme
- Electric charging points could have been funded via other grants for £4,200

Points raised

Recognised that this adds value to the project

DECISION - Approved subject to cumulative outputs achieved review

Digital Call Technopole Digital Platform variation

CG provided an overview of the Technopole digital platform

- HotSW Technopole that aims to drive the creation and growth of R&D intensive businesses within the region through the use of a digital platform.
- Platform would be owned by the LEP
- Create a good link with local digital businesses

Points raised

- How would this interface with the Growth Hub CRM?
- Recommended to appoint a provider via procurement rather than grant funding as LEP will have more input over the final product and legacy.
- Growth Hub could be involved in spec'ing'

DECISION – Approved the funding subject to procurement of provider.

4.3 Getting Building Fund (GBF)

Plymouth City Council Green Homes underspend variation

AMS provided an overview of Green Homes variation.

- Items bought before grant funding agreement was issued therefore grant funding is reduced
- Covid and Brexit are causing a delay in accessing homes and supply chains.
- Currently reviewing outputs and spend
