The Eastern Corridor Strategic Cycle Network aims to support the transformational shift to walking and cycling in Plymouth, by improving connectivity between development along the Eastern Corridor and Plymouth city centre.

This £4.9m package of new cycling and walking paths aims to create safe routes in the eastern part of the city. It will also include improved provision for cyclists and pedestrians within the city centre.
